Good Morning Friend,

Some years ago, Ann Landers, in her syndicated column, gave a definition of the Yiddish word, "noodnik." She explained it like this ... a noodnik is someone who spreads cheer by not showing up. Let me further add that a noodnik is someone you would rather not have around. His absence is better than his presence. If he does come, his presence will, at best, be tolerated or ignored. At worst, his presence will be painful or even destructive.

God wants you and me to be the opposite of that. Not noodniks, but refreshers and encouragers. In Paul's short letter to Philemon he uses many warm words and phrases to describe and affirm Philemon. He uses one word twice... the word *refresh*.

For we have great joy and consolation in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed by thee, brother. (Verse 7).

Yea, brother, let me have joy of thee in the Lord: refresh my bowels in the Lord. (Verse 20).

Philemon had the reputation of being a refresher. When he was around, joy and love would exude from him. I see many such people in the Bible. Titus brought *comfort* to Paul (II Corinthians 7:5-7). Jonathon helped David find *strength* in the Lord (I Samuel 23:16). Barnabas brought *encouragement* to his church in Acts 11... and also to John Mark and Paul. And Philemon brought *refreshment* to many. Each of these were messengers of God bringing God's attributes to people.

There still are refreshers among us. I have found certain authors to be refreshers in their writing. I have discovered certain preachers to predictably be refreshers in their preaching. God has brought some individuals into my life who have been refreshers. I'm not talking about individuals with powerful personalities. Nor people who are extroverts. It is something deeper. Not self-generated. The only explanation is that it is Jesus-generated.

One of Paul's life-long goals was that Jesus would be *magnified* in his body, whether by life or by death. (Philippians 1:20).

Many of you years ago often sang this chorus...

Let the beauty of Jesus be seen in me, All his wonderful passion and purity. Oh, Thou Spirit Divine, all my nature refine 'til the beauty of Jesus be seen in me.

As you spend time with Him, as you yield to Him, as you long for HIM above all else, He will refresh you and make you a refresher to others. Now begin to look for little ways to refresh others even if you are not physically near them... a prayer for them... a note to them... a phone call.

Be a refresher... and lots of refreshment will be returned to you from others and also from the greatest Refresher of all... Jesus, Himself.
